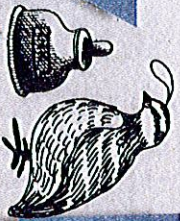

Sheriff Investigating Suspicious Stranger Incidents

The Sheriff's Department is investigating a series of reports of suspicious strangers following local school children as they walk to and from school in Los Osos.

According to Sgt. Pete Hodgkin, there have been three incidents in recent days involving suspicious persons. All three incidents were similar and involved people with similar descriptions, said Hodgkin. “We’re aware of it,” he said, “and we’re doing what we can but we have very little to work on.”

Hodgkin noted that none of the incidents involved the suspects attempting to touch or grab anyone.

In the first case, a little girl told officers that a man followed her as she was walking home on Doris Avenue from Monarch Grove Elementary School. The man was described as a white adult in his 40s, balding on top, and driving a white van. He was wearing glasses and possibly
