Volunteers are needed to help fix up facilities at San Luis Obispo County schools — and other locations — Saturday as part of Serve Day Central Coast.

The day to give back to the community is a collaboration of churches throughout the county, including Grace Bible Church in Arroyo Grande and New Life Community Church in Pismo Beach.

Specific numbers of volunteers are needed at each location.

Those who want to help should go to <http://servedaycentralcoast.com>, click on “serve,” then check the need at various locations and click on the site of their choosing for information on signing up and what to bring.

The website also lists which projects are considered “family-friendly” and which require adult hands.

Projects at Judkins Middle School in Pismo Beach needs the greatest number of volunteers — 60 at press time — for projects ranging from landscaping, grading and drainage work to installing siding, painting and more.

Work is scheduled there from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Ten volunteers were needed at Grover Beach Elementary School to build a paver walkway, paint and do general yard work and cleaning from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m.

At Fairgrove Elementary School, also in Grover Beach from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m., 15 volunteers are needed reroof a storage shed, replace a bench, paint and do yard work.

A force of 22 volunteers is needed at Oceano Elementary School to repaint a large mural, starting at 9 a.m.

No more volunteers are needed for projects planned at Mesa Middle School in Arroyo Grande and Nipomo Elementary School.

Other projects where help is needed are located at the South County Boys and Girls Club in Oceano, a private residence in Grover Beach, the Pismo Pier and the People's Kitchen in Pismo Beach and Sunrise Terrace Mobile Home Park and the Family Care Network and a writing letters to troops, all in Arroyo Grande.
